Wood called the Grantham Conservation Commission to order on Monday, Oct 5, 2020 at 7:05 p.m. The meeting was conducted in person with Wood, Payeur and Brown participating electronically.

APPROVAL OF MEETING MINUTES

DISCUSSION		
<p>Wood asked if there were any additions, corrections, or modifications to the draft minutes of the regular meeting of Sept 14, 2020. A correction was recommended by McArt. There being no other corrections, Wood announced that he would entertain a motion to approve the minutes as revised. A motion was made by Kaszeta; seconded by Hocker. OLD BUSINESS - SAWYER BROOK HEADWATERS (SBH)

DISCUSSION		
<p>Anne Payeur speaking for the Ausbon Sargent Land Preservation Trust (ASLPT) suggested that the first step in the development of the SBH should be the preparation of a management plan that describes the natural resources and habitats of the property. She noted that as part of the fund raising done by ASLPT some funds are available to support the preparation of such a plan if requested by the Selectmen. Brown noted that the project will likely need to be put out to bid. Brown also suggested that an effort should be made to determine whether earlier management plans had been developed by the previous owner, Bill Ruger. Hocker believes Ruger's forester would likely have been Troy Simino.</p> <p>It was also noted that Chief Parsons has Park Service experience and might serve as a helpful resource.</p> <p>Brown remarked that he is working with the Town to draft a town-owned land ordinance and clarify the issues regarding class VI roads of the town, including those associated with the SBH - Old Dunbar Hill Road, Croydon Turnpike and Hartshorn Road. He believes that Blackberry Way is a logging road and not a class VI road. Consequently, it may be possible to consider methods to restrict vehicular traffic on it to those permissible under the easement.</p> <p>Wood asked whether ASLPT would favor the creation of loop trails in the SBH. Payeur answered that her priorities would be to establish trails to avoid steep banks that might be subject to erosion, to avoid wet areas, and to minimize the impact on habitat.</p> <p>Payeur is waiting for the completion of the boundary blazing by the surveyor (expected by November) before organizing the annual monitoring of the property.</p> <p>Wood asked whether ASLPT would be supportive of a BioBlitz on the SBH if the UNHCE still plans to sponsor the program. With out additional information the question is unanswerable.</p>
